## **CHAIRS REMARKS**

The Chair welcomed committee members, and the following was noted:

- Saanich could play part in a multifaith annual conference with a focus on kindness and kinship.
- A future presentation could be on the opioid crisis.

# POINT IN TIME HOMELESSNESS COUNT

The Executive Director of the Community Social Planning Council of Greater Victoria gave a presentation on the Point in Time homeless count (PowerPoint on file). The following was noted in response to questions and during committee discussion:

- Unique solutions to homelessness that focus on a personal approach and may be worth exploring.
- Calgary developed a team to address domestic violence in the court system.
- The non-profit community could play a role in supporting homelessness prevention and mitigation.
- Potential systems could be put in place to provide parents with direction on how to support their children in times of crisis.
- Art could act as a way of expression, benefiting mental health, and promoting a sense of community.

- The school system could be involved in supporting youth through challenging times.
- Homelessness knows no borders and requires collective cooperation.
- Further discussion on this matter would be appreciated.

## WINTER FESTIVAL PROPOSAL

The Community Programmer II gave a presentation on the Winter Festival Proposal (Report on file). The following was noted in response to questions and during committee discussion:

- Adverse weather may pose a risk to an outdoor event.
- A celebration in January or February may appeal to more audiences.
- Other holidays such as family day and Groundhog Day could serve as alternative times for celebration.
- December is a busy time for celebrations and shopping.
- This event could have a multicultural focus and be approximately 4 to 5 hours in length.
- There is potential for the Royal Astronomical Society of Canada (RASC) to provide telescopes for entertainment if weather permits.
- This event could diversify itself by taking place in a location such as Panama Flats.
- Uptown could be more accessible for attendees as it has additional parking compared to the Municipal Hall.
- Option 2 of the report (Uptown Light Up) is preferred.
