


Colquitz Middle School Update

Background

The District of Saanich is committed to improving safety around its 39 schools and encouraging parents and children to choose active ways of getting to and from school. Active travel is not only a healthier choice, it is better for the environment and increases quality social time for families and friends in the neighbourhood.

Active and Safe Routes to School is a community based initiative that promotes the use of active transportation (walking, biking, bussing, and rolling) for the daily trip to and from school. To be successful, Active and Safe Routes to School involves many groups, including parents, students and school administration, school boards, municipal staff, public health, and local law enforcement agencies.

In 2015 the District of Saanich began work with the CRD, individual school Principals, Parent Advisory Committees, and the School District to develop planning documents to help guide future infrastructure decisions and identify solutions to problems in each school's vicinity. Every school community has its own concerns and suggestions for ways to reduce or eliminate them. Each solution



might be the responsibility of a different municipal department or even level of government. The purpose of this document is to provide an update to the school community on work that has been completed, and what is still left to do.

Interurban Rd at pull off loop	Review current usage of loop with Saanich Parks. Consider whether this could become alternative drop-off area for school.	Promote alternative student drop off location	Additional Locations around the school and community are available
Interurban Rd at pull off loop	Investigate warrant for crosswalk. Crosswalk would connect this drop off area with.	Install crosswalk	Review Completed and found that a crosswalk is not warranted due to proximity of other crossings
Colquitz River Trail between pull off loop & Dumeresq	Ensure stretch of Colquitz River Trail between pull off loop and Dumeresq is maintained at high frequency in order to increase comfort in students walking at least this small portion of trail.	Upkeep of Colquitz River Trail	Ongoing
Burnside Rd, East Side	Reduced visibility	Trim and maintain vegetation to ensure clear sidewalk and improve visibility.	Completed
Dumeresq St, east of school	Improve walking routes to school	Extend sidewalk on Dumeresq St on south side of street, east of school to Raymond St	Estimated completion 2022
Dumeresq St	Parking issues, traffic safety in school zone	Consider installing curbs on street surrounding school to alleviate parking issues.	Estimated completion 2022
Dumeresq St	Traffic safety in school zone	Review on-street parking bylaws.	Completed
Dumeresq St & Raymond St	Pedestrian and cyclist traffic safety concerns due to wide intersection, long crossing distance, with traffic no traffic control	Review potential pedestrian improvements and traffic calming measures along Raymond St.	Estimated completion 2022

Raymond St south of Columbine Way	Improve pedestrian and cycling safety along Raymond St	Extend Raymond St pedestrian/cycling corridor south of Columbine Way.	Additional Signage for bike route to be reviewed.
Interurban Rd at Dumeresq St	Improve traffic safety in school zone	Replace crosswalk sign with school crossing sign and fluorescent advance signs indicating "crosswalk ahead"	Review Completed - School crossing signs are only used when crossing guard present at a crosswalk.
Interurban Rd & Dumeresq St	Left-turning traffic on both Interurban Rd and Dumeresq St backs up into pedestrian crossings.	Investigate possibility of left-turn restrictions at this intersection.	Review completed - Left- turn restrictions not recommended. Ongoing enforcement and education of alternative locations are encouraged.
Dumeresq St	Reduce pedestrian crossing Dumeresq St at Interurban Rd.	Install sidewalk on north side of Dumeresq St	Active Transportation Plan - Long Term Priority
Colquitz River Trail	Poor visibility	Trim and control vegetation in trail system to improve sightlines & visibility. Trim overhead branches to maintain a 3.0m clearance, clear any vegetation 1.0m from the trail edge or keep vegetation trimmed to 0.5m height within 1.0-1.5m from the trail edge.	Ongoing
Intersection of Interurban Rd, Burnside Rd, & Galloping Goose	Control the crossing of multiple modes of transportation from different directions	Review intersection of Interurban Rd and Burnside Rd. & Galloping Goose for a full traffic signal	Review Completed - Traffic signal is not warranted
Burnside Rd, south of school	Improve traffic safety in the school zone	Relocate school area signage on Burnside Rd. to be centered around Dumeresq.	Signs are installed according to National Standards, relocation not recommended.

Southbound Interurban / Burnside cycling lane	Improve cycling routes to school	improving cyclists' ability to access crosswalk flashing beacons at (a) Interurban & Galloping Goose; (b) Burnside & Trans Canada Hwy off ramp (install button to active crosswalk signal on other side of post)	Existing buttons at Location A are adequate. Additional button has been installed at Location B.
Burnside Plaza & Tillicum Mall	Improve intersections	Improve intersections and traffic light phasing and auditory signal	Complete - Audible signals installed. Additional improvements to come through redevelopment.
