

#### Discussion

Community or Social Service Operating Grants are provided to non-profit organizations needing assistance to enhance their ability to address community or social issues or to provide access to appropriate community services that directly benefit the Saanich community. Enclosed is a summary of 2013 Community or Social Services Grant applications received. Background information submitted by each of the organizations including a letter of request and most recent financial statements has been provided where available. Original materials that are not able to be readily photocopied have been placed in a binder in the Councillors office for review.

Requests for ongoing funding of \$580,024 and one time requests of \$120,000 total \$700,024 for 2013. The requests have been summarized on the next page by category and one time/ongoing funding request. Reference has been made to the Economic, Environmental and Social themes in the Strategic Plan and Official Community Plan. Total requests exceed the 2013 core budget of \$567,600 by \$132,424.

While many of the returning organizations have maintained requests at 2012 levels several have requested increases varying from 2% to 100%. Details are included in each individual request. Of note is Saanich Legacy Foundation grant request of \$50,000 for a Little Spirits Garden at the Royal Oak Burial Park. Silver Threads request has increased by \$46,667 which reflects their request to take on the custodial services for the Les Passmore building under their operating agreement with the District. While it appears to be a significant increase, the decision will result in an overall cost reduction.

There are also eight new applicants as follows:

Organizations will have an opportunity to make a <u>brief</u> presentation at the March 19<sup>th</sup> Financial Plan meeting in alphabetical (A to Z) order. All applicants have been advised of the meeting and may be attending in support of their submission. Grant approval decisions are planned for the April 16<sup>th</sup> Financial Plan meeting.




#### Discussion

Neighbourhood Matched Project Grants provide funding to encourage community associations and other neighbourhood based non-profit organizations and community groups to undertake projects or events which strengthen neighbourhoods, promote participation and involvement through activities, build collaborative relationships and demonstrate an overall lasting benefit to the Saanich community. Enclosed is a summary of 2013 Neighbourhood Matched Project Grant applications received. Background information submitted by each of the organizations including a letter of request, a recent financial statement and a project budget statement have been provided. Original materials that are not able to be readily photocopied have been placed in a binder in the Councillors office for review.

Requests for matched project funding of \$22,800 exceed the 2013 core budget of \$12,500 by \$10,300. The requests are summarized as follows:



#### Discussion

Community Sustainability Grants are provided to community associations and non-profit organizations undertaking small projects that clearly demonstrate the principles of: protect and enhance air, water and land quality; sustain community infrastructure; energy efficiency and green technologies. Enclosed is a summary of 2013 Sustainability Grant applications received. All applications have been reviewed for eligibility by the Sustainability Coordinator. Background information submitted by each of the organizations including a letter of request, a recent financial statement and a project budget statement have been provided.

Fifty percent of the Climate Action Revenue Incentive Program (CARIP) funds received from the Province in 2013 have been allocated to fund these grants. Requests for the community sustainability grant exceed the available funding by \$2,315. The requests are summarized on the following page.

Community Association Operating Grants are provided to eligible, active, community associations to assist in defraying the annual administrative cost of operations. Applications have been received from eighteen eligible community associations totalling \$21,805. Individual supporting materials can be reviewed in the Councillor's office. Eligible associations may receive a maximum annual operating grant of \$1,100 based on expenditures plus a supplemental of \$550 if the Association represents an area with over 10,000 in population and a maximum of \$500 per year to cover cost of liability insurance.



Community Dry Grad Grants are provided to a graduating class of a Saanich Secondary School to support building a safer community through youth awareness and promotion of an alcohol free event.
