## A.R.P. Ambulance Ready for Service

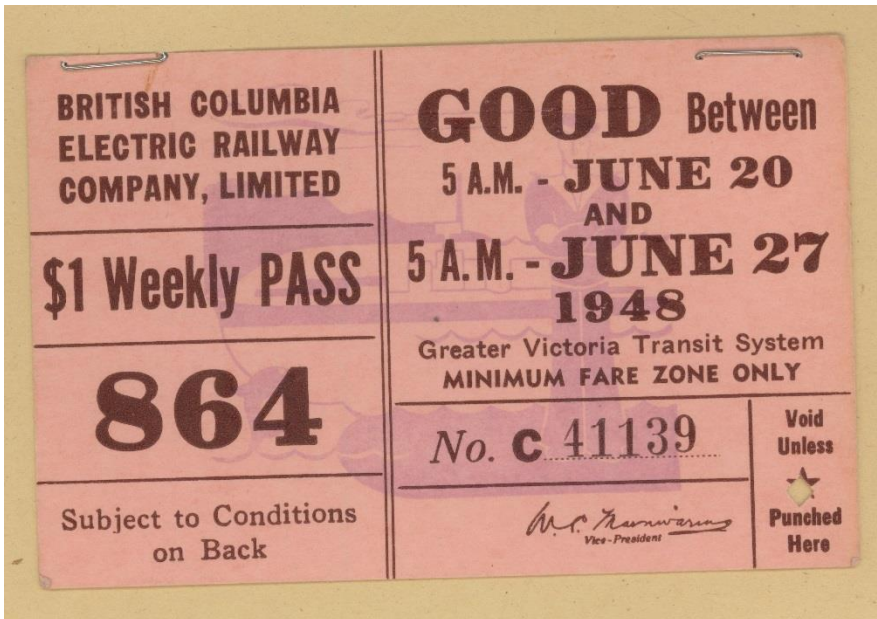
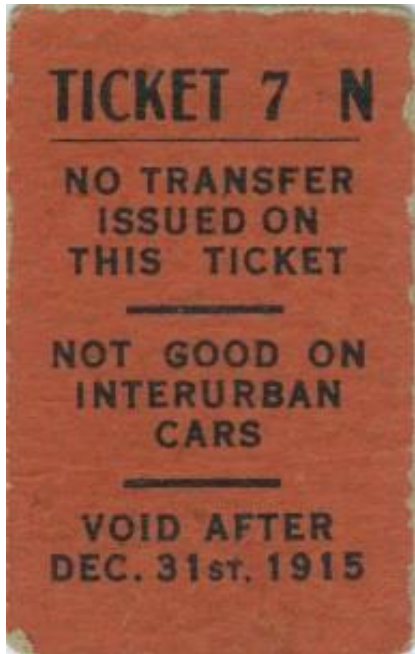


PICTURED above is the ambulance which Saanich Municipality has purchased for emergency use with funds contributed by its citizens in the recent campaign to buy and equip two such vehicles and outfit twenty-five panel delivery trucks for A.R.P. work. Standing in

front of the ambulance, left to right, are Miss M. Knipe, one of the corporation's public health nurses, and Miss S. Cunningham, of the Red Cross Corps. At the wheel is Herbert Stokes, driver and first aid instructor. The ambulance is equipped with two stretchers, a bench for at-

tendants or sitting cases, a first aid kit, blankets, hot water bottles and other essentials. The seat beside the driver is reversible, enabling attendants to work over casualties from there. A second ambulance is to be purchased later.
