

Group Booking and Tournament Guidelines for the Cedar Hill Golf Course

Due to the significant demand for tournaments, events, and group bookings, the Cedar Hill Golf Course follows these guidelines to support fair and equitable access to tee times for the community.

1. Group Bookings

- All bookings are at the discretion of the Pro Shop, operated by Lakeland Golf Management.
- Submit group booking requests to the Pro Shop: 250-475-7151.
- May to September: maximum of 40 golfers per week October through April: maximum of 60 golfers per week.
- Group is defined as: minimum of 12 and a maximum of 24 golfers.
- Requests for 9-Hole bookings are at the discretion of the Pro Shop and will depend on tee sheet availability.
- Requests for 18-Hole bookings are limited to 2 requests per year, per group. Please note: No ongoing weekly, biweekly, or monthly group bookings.
- Group bookings are available throughout the day on weekdays and only available during afternoon tee times on weekends.
- Submit a minimum of 7 days in advance of the proposed date.
- Submit all names and grouping of golfers to the Pro Shop a minimum of 7 days in advance of the confirmed booking date.
- Golfers are responsible for following course policies, rules, and etiquette.

2. Tournaments and Corporate Events (25+ golfers)

- All bookings are at the discretion of the Pro Shop, operated by Lakeland Golf Management.
- Submit group booking and event requests to the Pro Shop: 250-475-7151
- Submit a minimum of 7 days in advance of the proposed date including payment.
- Submit all names and grouping of golfers to the Pro Shop a minimum of 7 days in advance of the confirmed booking date.
- No shotgun starts.
- Requests for 18-Hole events are available anytime while requests for 9-Hole events are only available after 1 pm.
- Weekday events are limited to one per week.
- Limited availability for weekend events.
- Tournament Organizers must agree to and communicate to golfers the Golf Course rules & regulations and distribute information to participants prior to the event.

- Charges will apply for tournaments requiring additional course maintenance or markings.
- Golfers are responsible for following course policies, rules, and etiquette.

3. General Course Guidelines

- All members of the group must be present at the Pro Shop at least 5 minutes prior to their tee time.
- Check in with the Pro Shop prior to teeing off.
- Please follow directional signage for carts, ensuring carts maintain a 30 ft distance from the greens.
- Be mindful of noise levels while on the course and keep excessive noise to a minimum.
- Abusive or otherwise undesirable comments or gestures directed at other golfers, staff or volunteers is not tolerated.
- Golfers observed drinking alcohol excessively will be asked to leave.
- dispose of all garbage in the bins provided or pack garbage out after play.
- Be mindful of pace of play at all times.
- Golfers must enter the bunkers from the low side nearest their ball.
- Please replace your divots.

4. Course Rules

- Pro Shop and Marshals control play on course.
- Only two people per cart.
- Keep all carts outside the white lines – off tee off areas and greens.
- All staked trees – one club length drop – no penalty.
- All areas marked by white stakes are out of bounds.
- All ditches in rough: played as it lies or drop out two club lengths for one penalty stroke; gravel filled ditches, free drop.
- Driving range fence – no relief from a boundary fence; inside the fence is out of bounds.
- No alcoholic beverages on golf course unless purchased on the premises (LCB regulations). Violators must leave course, game is forfeited.
- Play ready golf and let faster groups play through.

5. Policies

- Golfers must adhere to the Inappropriate Guest Behaviour Policy. Immediate removal from the course, with no refund, will apply to golfers engaging in inappropriate, abusive, undesirable, or dangerous behaviour, conducting solicitation for personal or business gain, violate a Saanich bylaw or commit criminal acts on Saanich property.

- There is zero tolerance for personal alcohol on the Cedar Hill Golf Course. Golfers must purchase alcohol from the Golf Course Concession under the Cedar Hill Golf Course Liquor Licence and in accordance with the rules and regulations outlined by the Liquor and Cannabis Regulation Branch of the Province of British Columbia.
- There is no smoking or vaping on the golf course or surrounding park property per the CRD Clean Air Bylaw (#3962). Smoking within the park is also a violation of the Saanich Code of Conduct.
