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Introduction

The benefits of staying active are recognized in the District of Saanich's Strategic Plan, and upheld by initiatives such as the Active Transportation Plan (June 2018), and the Older Adults Strategy (2017 – 2022) (O.A.S.). The Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department (PRCSD) strives to enable all of its citizens to stay active and healthy - parks and trails are key to this system. The World Health Organization, Saanich Citizen Surveys, and the O.A.S. confirm that public washrooms effect how people can use parks and trails – they influence where people will visit and how long they can stay.

The Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department recognizes that well-placed, suitable public washroom facilities are important. Upgrading and adding washrooms to parks and trails is an initiative identified in the Parks, Recreation and Culture Master Plan (2013).

The Washroom Operations and Capital Plan compares existing facilities with Service Goals to identify the upgraded and new washrooms that are needed. Its goal is to outline how to effectively provide public washroom facilities over the next 7 years to maximize the number of people who can use the parks system.

Scope


This plan considers the existing and anticipated long-term parks and trail systems. Future development of parks and programs will assess the need for washroom facilities as each project is completed. As Saanich's population and settlement patterns change this plan may need to be revisited.

Intended Users and Purpose

The public facilities are intended to serve current and future park and trail users, and participants of PRCSD-led, and privately-led outdoor activities and programs that include children, adults, seniors, and the physically-challenged.

The purpose of public washroom facilities is:

- To provide toilet and hand washing/sanitizing facilities.
- To be available while parks, trails and/or programs are open or commonly used.
- To serve those of all ages and abilities wherever possible.



Criteria Used to Identify Optimal Locations

To identify optimal locations a number of parameters were used sequentially.

General 'Focus Areas'

Were identified to assess the need for upgraded and new washroom facilities. Focus areas are the most heavily used components of the parks system, they are:

Focus Areas:

- Highest-use parks
- Popular easy walking trails within parks
- Main trail network

Specific Locations within Focus Areas

Some of the specific locations are associated with activities and programs that are led by the PRCSD, including the Summer Neighbourhood Playground Program, Preschoolers in Parks Program, and walking and cycling programs; and activities that are led by independent fitness, walking and hiking groups, as well as private citizens.

Note that senior-friendly walking routes associated with all recreation centres (Cedar Hill, Gordon Head, G. R. Pearkes, and Saanich Commonwealth Place) are being planned independently as part of the Older Adults Strategy, 2017 - 2022. The washrooms within the associated recreation centre will serve these routes.

Main Trail Network:

- Saanich Centennial Trails (Blenkinsop Greenway, Colquitz River Trail, Glendale Trail, Interurban Rail Trail, Royal Oak Trail, San Juan Greenway).
- The Galloping Goose and Lochside Regional Trails are operated by the Capital Regional District (CRD). CRDinstalled facilities that support these trails are identified in this document and on the map on page 18.



Ideal Facility Spacing

A combination of Service Goals, and the typical travel speeds of target population groups is used to identify the ideal spacing of facilities within Focus Areas.

Service Goals of Focus Areas

- Highest-use parks facilities intended to serve visitors whose destination is limited to the park itself.
- Popular easy walking trails within parks facilities spaced within a 45 minute walk for slower walkers, including young children and seniors.
- Main trail network facilities spaced within a 1 ½ hour walk (or 25 minute bike ride) for average adults.

Travel Speeds

- Slower walkers seniors and children walk approximately
 1.6 km per hour
- Average adults walk approximately 4 km per hour

Ideal Facility Spacing in Focus Areas

Combining Service Goals and travel speeds reveals desired spacing:

- Highest-use parks one facility per park is typically adequate
- Popular easy walking trails within parks facilities within a 45 minute walk for a slower walker; or approximately 1.2 km apart
- Main trail network facilities within a 1 ½ hour walk for an average adult; or approximately 6 km apart

Focus Area Service Goals

- Minimum one facility in each Highest-use Park.
- A facility within a 45
 minute walk for slower
 walkers on Popular
 Easy Walking Trails
 within Parks –
 max. 1.2 km. apart.
- A facility within a 1 ½
 hour walk for average

 for ave. cyclists) on the
 Main Trail Network –
 max. 6 km. apart.

Identifying Gaps and Deficiencies

Currently there are 24 facilities consistently available to the public in Saanich Parks. A number of other facilities traditionally cater to sports clubs, or PRCSD -led programs in keeping with past service levels; currently these facilities are generally available to the public only when they are being used by the clubs or programs. Comparing existing availability with Service Goals reveals the need for improvements.

Proposed Upgrades and New Facilities

Siting Considerations

The Saanich Police Department reviewed facility locations from a Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) perspective, and identified factors which can improve users' safety, and perception of safety. Building design and placement, access, visibility, and landscaping recommendations will be implemented on a case by case basis, as possible.

Facility Types

The type of facility chosen is influenced by its proximity to other facilities, its anticipated level of use, the availability of water and sewer hookups, the Sewer Service Area, the physical realities of the site (trees, rock etc.), and its cost. Wherever possible existing facilities will be shared, rather than new ones built.

Alternative kinds of facilities were investigated including composting and combusting toilets. These systems are relatively delicate and will not withstand use by the general public.

- Portable toilets A single toilet without water, within a molded plastic enclosure. Uses a small holding tank. No sewer or water connection.
 - Consider creating privacy surrounds with wooden fences to increase the appeal of these toilets.
- Shared Shared use of flush toilets and sinks currently unavailable to the public (for example those used only by sports clubs).
- Pit toilets Single toilet without water, within a constructed enclosure. Large holding tank below ground.
 No sewer or water connection.
- New washroom buildings Purpose-built washroom buildings with flush toilets and sinks. Sewer and water connection.

Use and Hours



Facilities will be open daily from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m., year-round or seasonally (refer to the table on pages 8 - 14 for details), and will meet accessibility standards wherever feasible. Washrooms are for everyone's use, and are intended to be used by one person at a time. Exterior doors will be lockable from the inside, with the ability to open from the outside in case of emergency.

Approximate Capital and Operating Costs


Supporting Amenities

Implementation

Facilities will be installed / renovated in order of priority as determined by the number of anticipated users; importance to trail functionality; ease to create, and cost. The most cost-effective method of providing new flush toilet facilities will be determined through the Request For Information process in 2019.

This schedule may change in response to funding and capacity constraints.



Communication

Facility locations will be indicated on the Parks website, on new issues of the Parks and Trails maps, and on existing trail signs as they are installed and replaced. Facility type and the distances between them will be indicated on trail route-marker posts.

Operational

Service Increase:

The proposed new and shared public washroom facilities represent a135% increase in the number of flush toilets, and a 150% increase over-all (including pit and portable toilets). The Parks Division's staffing levels will need to be increased to meet the increased level of service.

Operational Cost:

The per-unit annual operational cost of pit and flush facilities is approximately \$23,000. The annual cost for portable toilets is \$1,800. These sums include opening and closing, cleaning, equipment and supplies, service vehicle, vandalism repair, and water, sewer and electrical costs where applicable.

Shared Facilities:

Where buildings are run by sports clubs, agreements regarding shared washrooms will be based on conversations between Club and Parks representatives on a case by case basis. Topics to be discussed include routine cleaning and maintenance, service costs, and opening / closing duties. Facilities shared with clubs will first proceed on a trial basis.

Capital

Implementing the Washroom Operations and Capital Plan will require a significant capital investment. Estimates to construct and convert washrooms as indicated in the schedule follow:
